

Captain Thecly H. Scott, PhD, CNM, FACHE **Nurse Corps, United States Navy**



CAPT Thecly Hines Scott is a native of Charleston, South Carolina. She holds a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University, a Master of Science in Nursing - Midwifery and Women's Health from the University of Pennsylvania, and a Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing from Duquesne University.

Scott began her Navy career after completing Basic Training in Orlando, Florida in 1989. She completed Aviation Electronic Technician A- School and reported to Patrol Squadron Five (VP-5) in Jacksonville, Florida, where she deployed in support of Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm and received a Naval ROTC – Nurse option scholarship.

Scott 's previous assignments include staff nurse on the other-infant unit, National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda, Maryland; staff nurse on labor, delivery, and recovery unit, U. S. Naval Hospital Guam; Medical Officer Recruiter, Naval Recruiting District, Richmond, Virginia; staff nurse on labor and delivery unit and Division Officer for obstetrical triage and antenatal testing center, Naval Hospital Jacksonville, Florida; Duty Under Instruction – Nurse Midwifery (CNM) and Women's Health Nurse Practitioner program, University of Pennsylvania; CNM, U. S. Naval Hospital Okinawa; CNM and Department Head, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Naval Hospital Bremerton, Washington; CNM, Department Head for Maternal Infant Nursing, and Senior Nurse Officer for the Surgical Services Directorate, Naval Medical Center San Diego, California.

Operationally, Scott served as Executive Officer for the NATO Role 3 Multinational Medical Unit, Kandahar Airfield, Afghanistan, and provided oversight of daily operations, casualty receiving, and tactical planning for medical care delivered to U. S., Coalition, and Afghanistan forces deployed in support of Operations Freedom Sentinel and Resolute Support.

Executive assignments include Director of Surgical Services, Naval Hospital Bremerton, Washington, where she also served as the Acting Lead for the Puget Sound Military Health System Surgical Consortium which included surgical team members from Madigan Army Medical Center and Naval Hospitals Bremerton and Oak Harbor. She later returned to Naval Hospital Bremerton where she served as Executive Officer and Commanding Officer of Expeditionary Medical Facility NOVEMBER 150-bed platform. Scott served as Commanding Officer of U.S. Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command/Naval Hospital Guam, supporting 43 tenant commands and forward deployed joint service personnel and theater operational plans in the Indo-Pacific area of responsibility. She is currently serving in her Senior Executive Medicine/Post-Command tour as Deputy Director for the San Diego Market, Defense Health Agency.

In addition to numerous unit and campaign awards, her personal awards include the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal (three awards), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (two awards), Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (two awards).

Scott maintains board certification as a Certified Nurse Practitioner and Women's Health Nurse Practitioner and is a Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives.
